Only Library to Receive Award

Janet Marler, Head librarian of Marion City Library, announced that it had received a 5-Star national rating from the Library Journal for 2017, but gave credit to the staff, the board, and mostly to the community for their contributions to the honor.

Without the community usage of the library's services, the award would not have been possible, according to Marler.

"We did the work but the community supported us and helped us get this (award). It can't be possible if the community doesn't use us," she said.

The annual rating is based on per capita circulation, library visits, number of programs, program attendance, public internet computer usage and e-circulation. Although it is a national rating, not every state had libraries that qualified. Kansas had twelve libraries receive ratings ranging from 3-5 but Marion City Library was the only library in Kansas, in its budget category, to receive the top 5-star honor.

Marler's plans for the library's future are to, "continue growing by offering more so that people realize what a great library and staff we have."

A reception will be February 18, from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. at the library. The mayor, library board and staff will be on hand for a presentation of the 5-star award at 4 p.m. The public is invited to attend.
